

<u>Las Vegas Fun Rally — 24-28 April</u>: As of now, there are two convoys planned for the drive to the event; one leaving Tuesday and one leaving Wednesday. For those attending the April meetings there will be sign-up sheets so we know whom to expect when.

Scenic Route: Meet at Perfect Copy at 6839 Mowry Ave. in Newark (Note: this is a new location!) on *Tuesday* morning at 8:30 a.m. Departure will be at 9:00 a.m. Promptly. <u>PCNC Karting Challenge</u> — 11 May: Greg Jacobs is organizing a group gathering at the Speedring indoor racing facility in Santa Clara. Our group will be issued full safety gear, then get launched in groups of 14 for fifteen minutes of pre-race practice and qualifying. Once that process is complete, we'll have 35-minute sprint races, with unlimited passing, on-board telemetry, and everything the Formula 1 guys get except the prize money! 

The meeting adjourned to the parking lot at 9:50, where the two new Panteras were admired long into the night.


Pantera Club of Northern California Air ConditioningTech Session and Professional Appraisal Saturday, 20 April, 9:30 a.m. to midnight


