Minutes of Meeting 25 September, 2003

The meeting was called to order by the president, after a bit of chit-chat, at 8:12 p.m. All officers were present except for John Hansen, Mark McWhinney, and Mike Drew. Roxanne Fertitta again kindly stepped in to take notes. Unfortunately she forgot to tally the number of people and cars present, but suffice it to say that there were a bunch of people, and some De Tomaso cars in the parking lot.

<u>New Members/Guests</u>: The club welcomed **Rick Ransom** from Fresno. He has a '73 Pantera L that he purchased *new* and has owned ever since. It only has 25,000 miles on it, but it has been painted five times. He said that he had lost interest in the car for some time, but lately has been inspired by fellow Fresno-ite Larry Finch, and is now eager to meet the group and participate in

events with the car.

<u>Corrections To Last Month's Minutes</u>: It was pointed out that the word "tpyo" was misspelled....

<u>Club Store Report</u>: Evidently there was no news from the club store.

<u>Club Treasury Report</u>: Since the last meeting, Jim had only written two (small) checks, so our account is looking good.

<u>Club Library Report</u>: Howard said he had no news to report, but he was happy to be back at a PCNC meeting after a relatively long absence.

<u>Club Membership Report</u>: Russ said that things had been operating smoothly for the past month.

<u>Club Motorsports Report</u>: There was quite a bit of news and discussion regarding the Las Vegas track event. The Track Committee was scheduled to meet privately following the general meeting.

Bill reported that he has successfully rescheduled the reservations for the track event. The Las Vegas Fun Rally coordinators moved the date of the 2004 event and we hadn't been aware of it, so originally we had booked the track for the week *after* the Fun Rally! Thanks to some fancy footwork on Bill's part, we extracted ourselves from that commitment and secured the track for the correct dates.

The Track Committee is adding one more position to the committee, that of PR Coordinator. His responsibilities will be to ensure an ongoing web presence, advertising, promotion of the event on the Pantera International and De Tomaso e-mail forums, and POCA newsletter publicity. Chuck Melton has performed some or all of these tasks in the past and has been approached to take on this position for 2004. The ultimate goal is to find way to attract more attendees in order to reduce the per-person cost of the track event. The PR Coordinator could also help bring in more sponsorship through increased advertising and promotion.

The track event just barely managed to reach the break-event point for 2003, and there was some discussion as to whether we should scale back and just have a one-day event for 2004. There was also discussion about the fact that historically the club store has been the major money-maker for the club, and there is a perception that the staffing demands of the track event negatively impact the manning for the club store. Todd suggested that *all* the activities that the club stages should be geared towards turning a profit, rather than expecting the club store alone to be responsible for earning funds for the club.

Michael Fertitta pointed out that overall attendance at this year's Las Vegas event was down, particularly among PCNC members, so that presumably had a significant impact on the store as well.

Somebody suggested that since traffic is slow at the club store area during the track event anyway, the store should be closed during those hours, and track event T-shirts should be brought to the track and sold on-site.

Overall, there was a significant amount of discussion on these and other issues, culminating in a motion to once again hold a two-day track event. It's believed that a one-day event doesn't offer enough track time to justify bringing a track car a long distance, while a two-day event makes this more viable. Steve made the argument, "Now is not the time to pull back, and we should give it one more try, then evaluate our performance for 2005". The motion for the two-day track event passed.

Past Events:

<u>Ferrari Club Comedy Day</u>: Several members attended a Comedy Day in Golden Gate Park, where a small Italian car show was staged by the local chapter of the Ferrari Club of America. Besides the car show, there was free food and drink, backstage passes to the show, and PCNC as a group is invited to participate again next year.

<u>Larry Henley Car Show</u>: Larry hosted another successful show at his shop, with a total of 329 cars in attendance, including two Panteras.

Upcoming Events:

<u>Fall Fix-It Tech Session At the Sharps — 11 October</u>: Roger and Pam will once again be hosting a tech session at their home in Morgan Hill, starting at 9:00 a.m. and running until ???? Chuck volunteered to drive down and help set up the evening before. Todd and Oscar will once again perform as the chefs. See the flyer elsewhere in this newsletter for directions.

All Italian Car Show — 12 October: This extremely low-key event is an annual fundraiser for the Alameda Special Olympics, put on by the Alfa Romeo club. PCNC has had a presence at this show since its inception over ten years ago. It is held on the grounds of the Lincoln Middle School in Alameda, and normally attracts between 100 and 200 cars. Doug Abadie will be organizing the PCNC contingent, and hopefully arranging a special parking area for our cars. 
