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Minutes of Meeting 24 June, 2004

The meeting was called to order at 8:01 by vice-president Todd Glyer in Terry Morofsky's absence. All officers were present except for Larry Stock, the Pucketts, and John Hansen. 36 people signed the roster and there were nine De Tomaso cars in the parking lot.

<u>New Members/Guests</u>: The club welcome several new faces. **Kevin Felt** recently moved to the Bay Area from Arizona. A long-time Shelby guy, he is currently building a Cobra replica, and found out about PCNC after joining the local Shelby club. He has always been intrigued by our cars and is interested in learning more—the first step towards ownership!

Peter and Catie Cajthaml took the giant plunge and recently purchased the radical 1972 Pan-

tera formerly owned by Jay Leone in Marin County. This car was one of the first cars to receive the full Hall Pantera treatment, including the fitment of a GT5 body kit. They were fortunate enough to buy a quality car and are now on-board to learn more about it!

Brian Bernard brought **Travis Sherman**, a local kid who has helped him work on his cars, to share the Pantera ownership experience.

And in terms of new cars in the parking lot, **Tom Hasenberg** sold his decidedly scruffy black '73 and picked up an absolutely beautiful and largely stock yellow '74 (number 7264, a 7/74 car) from a friend. His friend had purchased it back in 1990 with only 6,000 miles on the clock. It has been lovingly driven since then, and now still has only 16,000 miles. Tom worked out a deal whereby he sold his old car in southern California, and picked up his new car the same day and hauled it back home. The Campy wheels are in his garage, still shod with the original Arriva tires, and it is currently running on aftermarket wheels and tires. Well-done Tom!

<u>Presentation To Roger Sharp And Jim Kuehne</u>: On behalf of John Hansen, Gary Kono made a formal presentation to Roger and Jim of a pair of Pantera-embroidered tool bags, given in recognition of all the people they have helped on the side of the road over the years. They were then given a well-deserved round of applause.

<u>Chris Wilson Visit</u>: Jim spoke of a recent visit by Chris Wilson, the fellow from New Zealand who stumbled into our merry band on his way to the Las Vegas event. Chris was in town for business, and spent a day with Jim and Roger.

Edelbrock 351C Aluminum Heads On The Way: Bob Lucas was at a recent Shelby club meeting where a representative from Edelbrock spoke about upcoming products, including boltin aluminum replacement cylinder heads for the 351C in both 2v and 4v quench configurations! Historically Edelbrock heads have generated power gains of anywhere from 25-50 hp with no other modifications, so this comes as great news to Pantera owners who have historically had to rely on obsolete Ford racing heads if they wanted to go the lightweight route. These new Edelbrock heads are designed to utilize standard intake and exhaust configurations, and will be priced similarly to their other offerings, around \$900 for bare heads and \$1200 for completely assembled heads.

<u>New Pantera Models Available</u>: Chuck Melton had several goodies and gadgets for sale, including some new Tomy Pantera models. These cars are Hot Wheels-sized but offer terrific detail, and are painted in Euro GTS colors. He has them for sale for only \$12 each.

<u>Larry Finch Update</u>: Larry reported that his Pantera repairs are progressing, slowly but surely. Tom Dupart went and examined the car, and reported that the front end has been put back together. They have ambitions of painting the car sometime in July. Larry also passed around photos of the work in progress.

<u>Paul DaCruz In Sports Car International</u>: SCI magazine printed an article of the top 10 sports cars of the '70s in their July issue, as chosen by a host of automotive writers. The Pantera made several of their lists, and Paul and his white '72 Pre-L were chosen to represent the marque.

Bob Blows A Motor: Bob Benson's Shelby GT-350 replica with a 347 stroker motor gave a great performance at the Las Vegas Speed Trials, and he took it to Thunderhill to run a recent Shelby event. Running hard after lunch, on the front straight he heard a bang and thought he blew a tire, as there was smoke trailing from the right rear corner of the car, and coming out of the trunk. He pulled off the track and found all four tires looked fine, but looking back down the

track he spotted a wrist pin, a piece of connecting rod, another piece of connecting rod, another wrist pin, etc. Looking under the car he saw a monster hole through the bottom of his oil pan. This practically new engine had only 11 track days on it, probably no more than 20-30 hours of running. This is the 7th or 8th motor he's blown up over the years. 
