Minutes of Meeting 29 September, 2005

The meeting was called to order by Bob Benson shortly before 8:00 p.m. All officers were present except for Terry Morofsky, Sharon Renshaw and Mike Drew; Steve Liebenow kindly took notes for the meeting minutes. There were 40 members present, with 12 De Tomaso cars in the parking lot.

<u>New Members/Guests</u>: The club was pleased to welcome Garry and Sue Choate from San Ramon. They purchased their red 73 Pantera L about five months ago; it currently has about 34,000 miles on the clock.

Also in the crowd was Mike Kearny, a guest of Rich Boschert, who is on the hunt for a Pantera

of his own.

<u>Changes To Last Month's Minutes</u>: Todd Glyer is not in charge of the Christmas dinner; Diane Dean is still heading up that committee.

<u>**Club Treasury Report</u>**: Jim reported that after paying all of our (large) bills associated with the Monterey event, we still have plenty of money left in our treasury to fund next year's various activities.</u>

<u>**Club Store Report</u>**: Gary reported that the club store director is somewhere out in the Mexican waters, and "hadn't been heard from for days." Thus there was no new activity to report.</u>

<u>**Club Website Report</u>**: Mike Drew went back through his archives and retrieved all PCNC newsletters dating back to 1996, converted them to PDF format and sent them to Mark; they can now be viewed on the website. Mark also has been continually updating the site with news of upcoming events.</u>

<u>Club Membership Report</u>: Russ wasted no time in signing up the guests present and turning them into new members!

Past Events:

<u>Fun Ford Sunday</u>: Steve Liebenow reported that there was only one club member there (him) with only one club car (his Mangusta). The weather was beautiful and the show was filled with Fords of every type and description. Everybody who wasn't there, really missed out.

Curt Hall Cam Change Tech Session: Roger described the multi-weekend camshaft changing tech session which took place at his house (and which was detailed in an article in last month's newsletter). Curt Hall's bone-stock '74L finally received a horsepower increase with the installation of a new camshaft, closed-chambered heads, a new intake manifold and a rebuilt carb. Naturally, all didn't go perfectly smoothly, and Roger described the project as both "interesting" and "colorful". During the course of the project, Roger learned how to run a milling machine. Roger's master mechanic Paul was ready to tear down the entire bottom end, much to Jim and Roger's dismay, but he was overruled. After several weeks the car left the driveway, leaving a big pile of old parts behind, and Curt is absolutely thrilled with the results. Note that due to work conflicts, Curt never actually was able to help with the project on his own car!

Eagle Ridge Golf Course Show: Roger was invited to show his Pantera at a small show held at a local golf course; among the other notable cars present was the white '56 Chevy built and formerly owned by Jim Kuehne. He was finally back on track, and noticed squirrely handling attributed to a tire that had lost some air; the motor was also definitely off-song. On top of that, he was black-flagged for excessive noise, and had the noise meter location pointed out to him for future reference!

Back in the pits, he tore into the carburetor to change jets, but the car still didn't run right. After much consultation and head-scratching, he discovered that the carbon ball inside his distributor cap had badly worn; both his cap and rotor were trashed. He was done.

Upon getting the car home, further investigation revealed that one of the small wires leading to the distributor had fouled an engine pulley and was almost cut through! So a new distributor assembly is in the cards, and he will be trying again at the next Shelby club track event on October 15-16.

Look out Hawaii!



The meeting adjourned to the parking lot at 9:15 p.m.




Membership News
