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# Minutes of Meeting 30 March, 2006

The meeting was called to order by the president at 8:09; the delayed start was due to a few computer glitches with the secretary's laptop. Of the club's officers, Bob Benson, Mark McWhinney and John Hansen were absent; Sharon Renshaw made a rare appearance, as did our former rafflemaster, Larry Stock. There were 27 members in attendance, but due to the inclement weather, there were no De Tomaso cars in the parking lot.

New Members/Guests: There were no new faces in the crowd this month.

Changes To Last Month's Minutes: Darryl Johnson was inadvertently referred to as Darryl

Adams; Darryl Adams is a Mangusta owner from Chicago who periodically visits PCNC meetings and events. Whoops! (Darryl is also an artist; his Pantera drawing is featured at the end of these minutes).

<u>Club Treasury Report</u>: Jim reported that cash from the track event is still coming in, including sponsorship and participant income. Too, Jack DeRyke sold Bill Santos' full collection of back issues of POCA newsletters, *Profiles* and *Pantera International* on E-bay and netted the club an additional \$450.

<u>Club Store Report</u>: John Hansen reported to Gary Kono that this year's club store theme is "stuff from last year" including lots of T-shirts. Attendance at the Fun Rally is expected to be at last year's level, or perhaps slightly higher. Given that this is the 35th anniversary of the Pantera, a tentative T-shirt design by Todd Glyer was passed around. Several people noted that the design featured a Pantera emerging from Alejandro De Tomaso's left nostril, and thus it received a very mixed review! Close, but not quite there yet....

<u>Club Membership Report</u>: Russ reported that with the formation of a new Pacific Northwest POCA chapter, PCNC suddenly experienced a sudden drop in their membership, as all of our Washington/Oregon members have understandably jumped ship.

<u>Club Website Report</u>: As Mark was absent, there was no formal report. However, the latest and greatest information on the Las Vegas event will be posted there, so check it out!

#### **Past Events**:

<u>Doug Abadie Motor-Pulling Tech Session</u>: Doug Abadie and Kay Schwartz were both present, and gave a short account of the small tech session they hosted at their house in Berkeley (covered in depth in an article in last month's newsletter). Doug wanted to publicly thank those who participated, and made note of what a terrific club we have!

#### **Upcoming Events**:

<u>Pre-Las Vegas Tech Session</u> — <u>22 April</u>: Roger and Pam Sharp will once again open their homes to us and host the traditional pre-Vegas tech session. Larry Stock will be attending and will be bringing many parts down from Reno, but if you have any specific jobs in mind, please contact him ahead of time to ensure that he brings the parts you need. You must pre-coordinate for air conditioning service, otherwise he will not bother dragging his stash of R-12 and R-134.

Note that there is a new exit at Bailey Blvd. off Hwy 101; this exit will save several minutes over the previous route from Bernal Road. See the flyer elsewhere in this newsletter for a map and more information.

<u>Las Vegas Fun Rally — May 3-7</u>: The deadline for making your hotel reservations was March 30th; after that date, all the POCA rooms remaining unsold were returned to the hotel, and you will have to fend for yourself. However, Kent Snyder may know of upcoming cancellations, so if you have failed to make your reservations already, contact Kent and see what he can do for you.

Be advised when making your hotel reservations that the rates have gone up quite a bit, so be sure to shop around.

Due to the ongoing inclement weather, and the fact that Marcus Smith has to go out of town the week of the Las Vegas event, the convoy routing will instead be the same as last year's. The main party will be leaving the South Bay area on Tuesday morning at 9:00 a.m., and heading east to rendezvous with central valley members on Hwy 99. The rendezvous point is yet to be determined; contact Diane if you are considering joining the convoy from other than the starting location.

Our lunch stop will probably be in Visalia; we are still waiting to hear if Rich James will be hosting us again. We will be spending the night at the Kernville Inn. Be sure to mention AAA DISCOUNT as opposed to PCNC in order to get the numbah-one good deal of \$82.10 per night (same as last year). You must phone the hotel at (760) 376-2206 to make your own reservations.

Gary Kono will be in charge of the group that will be leaving on Wednesday morning for Las Vegas, driving straight through to arrive Wednesday evening. Contact Gary if you want to link up with that bunch.

Among the events planned for the Fun Rally is a tour of the Thunderbirds facility at Nellis AFB on Friday afternoon at 1:00 p.m. Due to greatly heightened security measures, anyone planning on taking part in the tour *must* have their names in to Kent Snyder no later than **Friday**, **21 April**. After that date, the Air Force will no longer allow any people to be added to the tour list.

<u>Las Vegas Speed Trials</u> — <u>May 4-5</u>: Larry Finch is fine-tuning the track event arrangements. Sponsorship is up, and participant signups are also solid; we are very close to breaking even. All the information on the event can be found on the club's website. The track event program has been printed and mailed to Kent Snyder for him to stuff into the event packets; all the required safety forms, waivers etc. have been printed and mailed to the Pucketts.

<u>Lodi Wine & Chocolate Tour — 13 May</u>: Greg Jacobs has volunteered to organize a scenic drive through the eastern Bay Area, culminating in wine tasting, lunch and a tour of a chocolate factory in Lodi. <u>Silver State Classic Challenge</u> — 18-19 May: From a high of 19 Panteras signed up to participate in this epic event, the number has dropped to 14, but there is still time to sign up!

<u>Reno/Tahoe Fun Rally — 7-11 June</u>: The Reno/Tahoe Pantera Club will again be hosting a fun rally high in the Sierras; Harrah's hotel is once again the hosting facility. All the details will be announced in the May POCA newsletter; among the planned events are a dyno day, Go-Kart racing, a tour of a large private car collection, and more.

<u>Monterey Historics Races/Concorso Italiano — 17-20 August</u>: Registration for the Los Laureles Lodge has been opened up to all POCA members. A \$100 deposit is required to hold

your room; the event costs are still being worked out but will likely be very similar to last year. We only have 22 rooms available to us, and 17 of them are already reserved!

One of the themes of the Concorso Italiano is the 35th anniversary of the Pantera, so it stands to reason that there will be a higher-than-normal number of De Tomaso devotees present, so plan accordingly!

#### **Buy/Sell/Swap**:

New Products From Pantera Parts Connection: Larry Stock has been busy over the winter. Among his new products are brand new Brembo replacement rear brake rotors, w which are both vented and drilled. He is also having new GT5-style wheels made, with rear wheels in both 17- and 18-inch. He will have a complete 17-inch Campy clone wheel package available for \$2315, including tires! He also has tooled up to produce a billet aluminum water bottle bracket.






