Minutes of Meeting 27 July, 2006

The meeting was called to order by the president at 8:03 p.m. The meeting featured unusually strong turnout, particularly among club officers; virtually all officers were present, except for Larry Finch and John Hansen. 37 people signed the roster, and there were seven Panteras plus a Mangusta in the parking lot.

<u>New Members/Guests</u>: The club welcomed **Rick Cannon**, who purchased a '71 Pantera in a million pieces. As he is unusually large (approaching McWhinney-esque proportions), he is already planning on modifying the cabin so that he can fit into it! He's still undecided as to how he will finish it, as he is seduced by both the street/showcar and the open track aspects of the Pantera.

Also making their first appearance were Ron and Bobbie Demaderios. They just purchased a

1971 Pantera, No. 1683, from Texas. The car is equipped with a 5.4 liter modular motor, with carbon fiber everywhere. At the time of the meeting, the car was on a transporter bound for California. According to Ron, the car is leaking oil and has a few other minor issues. He said he bought it from a lawyer, and "like all lawyers, he lied to me!"

Long-Lost Friends: Besides our newest members, it was nice to see some long-lost members returning to the fold. **Jon Long** drove his immaculate orange L-model Pantera to his first meeting in at least ten years. And **Jack and Judy DeRyke** were in town visiting friends and joined the crowd as well.

<u>Changes To Last Month's Minutes</u>: Some members hadn't received their newsletter for some reason, but Judy DeRyke noted that the newsletter stated that the upcoming meeting was on 26 July 2005, not 2006.

<u>**Club Treasury Report</u>**: Jim confirmed that in fact he did not skip town with the club's treasury, and in fact it is substantially healthy, although he is getting ready to write some fat checks for the upcoming Monterey event.</u>

<u>**Club Store Report</u>**: Gary Kono brought several boxes of club store merchandise, which drew quite a crowd to the back of the room. Wallets were opened, transactions were made and the club actually made a fair profit, with lots of happy customers driving home with new Pantera swag for their closets. Among the deals on offer were black T-shirts for \$15, and 35th anniversary commemorative T-shirts for \$20. Leftover track event T-shirts were a bargain at only \$10 each.</u>

<u>Club Membership Report</u>: Russ had nothing significant to report.

<u>**Club Website Report</u>**: Mark hobbled into the meeting sporting a cast on his foot, a result of a minor miscalculation while negotiating a small step. This handicap has given him plenty of opportunity to remain seated, and he has taken advantage of it by making lots of updates to the upcoming events page of the club website. He also noted that for the first time, the PCNC newsletter is available for viewing/download in full color.</u>

Upcoming Events:

<u>Monterey Historics Races/Concorso Italiano — 17-20 August</u>: One of the themes of the Concorso Italiano is the 35th anniversary of the Pantera, so it stands to reason that there will be a higher-than-normal number of De Tomaso devotees present, so plan accordingly!

Contrary to what many may have hoped, the final cost of the rooms at the PCNC host lodge is not just \$100! Final payment will be due before the event, and different rooms come with slightly different costs. Diane will e-mail each guest to let them know their balance remaining. She also noted that the cost has remained unchanged for the past three years. Due to a reversal of fortune, the two-room British Porsche racing team surrendered their suites as they are not coming to the event this year, so they are now available (for a limited time).

The dinner this year will feature an Italian theme. The cost for those not staying at the hotel will be \$45 each. The inside lawn parking will be for De Tomaso cars only. This year she is establishing a cutoff of 80 people; previous years have seen 95 or so guests at the dinner.

Fun Ford Sunday — **10 September**: The annual Fun Ford Sunday will again be held at the Solano County Fairgrounds, at the intersection of I-80 and Hwy 37 in Vallejo. This is the northern California counterpart to the Fabulous Fords Forever show at Knott's Berry Farm in April, and this fall event draws upwards of 1,000 cars. Steve Liebenow will be organizing the PCNC contingent, so please let him know if you plan to attend so he can save you a spot. See the flyer elsewhere in this newsletter for all the details.

<u>Nor-Cal Shelby Club Mini-Nats — 22-24 September</u>: The annual convention of the Nor-Cal Shelby Club (which welcomes De Tomaso cars with open arms) will be held at Sears Point. See the club's website (www.norcal-saac.org) for all the information.

<u>Comedy Day In Golden Gate Park — 1 October</u>: The automotive portion of the event is staged by a local Ferrari owner, but all De Tomaso cars are invited. Those who display their cars alongside the stage are provided with free VIP tickets to the show, dinner, wine, and a backstage pass. In previous years, major-league comedy starts like Robin Williams, Dave Chappelle, Dave Attell and others have participated. A PCNC convoy will leave the south bay at 9:15 a.m.; the show starts at noon. <u>All-Italian Car And Motorcycle Show — 8 October</u>: This show is hosted by the Alfa Romeo club and is a benefit for the Alameda Special Olympics. Basically a Concorso Italiano Lite, this low-key car show has been supported to varying degrees by PCNC in the past, with as many as a dozen Panteras appearing one year, and only one appearing other years. Typically there are between 100 and 200 cars present. The event is free for exhibitors, and only costs \$5 for spectators. Italian music and excellent food are on tap as well. <u>Washington Square Columbus Day Car Show — 8 October</u>: Once again sadly conflicting with the above event, this car show is for Italian exotics only. The cars are displayed in a cordoned-off area of Washington Square in San Francisco, along the route of the annual Columbus Day parade. Those who display their cars are given a free bottle of wine and lunch.

<u>Thunderhill Track Day — 19 October</u>: Although not, strictly speaking, a PCNC event, a number of PCNC members have decided to run their cars at Thunderhill on 19 October. Because it's a midweek date, the number of participants is low, which means track time is unusually high. Bob Benson is corralling the Pantera participants, so if you're interested, let him know! On the first full day, the group enjoyed a great luncheon,

followed by a tour of the museum, and finally two and a half hours of open track time on the legendary mountain circuit.

The car ran faultlessly after that, although due to the small fuel tank the previous owner had curiously fitted to the car, Patrick ran out of gas on the last lap of his last race!


New Members for August:
