Minutes of Meeting 29 November, 2007

News, Clues and Rumors:

Mangusta Makeover Madness: Greg Taylor gave another update on the restoration of his mangled Mangusta. The center of the car (the center of the body, roof, floors, sills and doors) is now complete, and the back of the car should be finished in a month. With some help, he is fabricating new lower valance panels from scratch. Once that's done, the Sawzall comes out, and he will cut the entire front end of the car off and graft on a new front end from a burned-out Mangusta from southern California. Greg is doing all of the metal work himself, although he has a friend who is an expert who is helping for one or two hours a week, giving advice and direction which Greg then attempt to follow throughout the rest of the week.






The winners were Diane Dean, Mike Drew and Roger Sharp.


