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Minutes of Meeting 27 June, 2008

<u>Club Treasury Report</u>: Steve indicated that the club's treasury was healthy. We will soon be writing some fat checks to pay for the various aspects of the Monterey event however.

There were just under 200 cars entered in the show, including multiple genuine Shelby and Boss Mustangs. There were plenty of new Shelby Mustangs there too. Darryl Johnson took home the first place trophy in the Pantera class, although he wasn't eligible for the 'best engine' award since he got it last year!

<u>Monterey Historic Races/Concorso Italiano Weekend — 13-16 August</u>: Dianne announced that room reservations are now open to all POCA members at the Los Laureles Lodge. A \$100 deposit will hold a room; final room prices are still being determined. Several POCA members have already scooped up rooms, so if you are planning on attending and don't have your room yet, don't wait any further!

Pantera International has decided to abandon their traditional parking corral/trackside BBQ at Laguna Seca. PCNC will now host the parking corral, but will not make the extensive financial commitment to host a BBQ or hospitality tent. Corral parking will be free for those people purchasing tickets from PCNC.

Volunteers will be needed to 'police' the parking area and keep non-De Tomaso interlopers out (at least in the first few hours of the day), and a cat-herder will be required to actually pick

Dyno Day Tech Session — **27 September**: Roger Sharp has once again arranged to have a portable dynomometer brought to his house. We did this once before, in 1995, and this was without a doubt the club's most popular (and well-attended) tech session. The club will be paying \$1000 to have the dyno operating for an eight-hour period in Roger's driveway; we will charge \$50 each, and each driver will get two pulls.

The priority for dyno use will be club member cars, and Panteras will receive further priority. We will need maximum participation to make the event financially viable.



MPH 110.95 (at 1/4 mile)




Newsletter Advertising Policy


