Minutes of Meeting 18 November, 2010

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. sharp by the president. All officers were present except for Steve Liebenow and Trevor Fougere. There were ten Panteras in the parking lot, and 42 members signed the roster.

<u>New Members/Guests</u>: The club welcomed **Evan Matthews**, a fuel-injection tuning wizard who worked miracles on the fuel-injected Panteras of Peter Kovacs and Ron DeMaderios, and Darryl Johnson's carbureted Pantera too; Evan brought his friend **Seth** with him.

We also welcomed **Mark Savage**, who is a stealth member of PCNC. He joked that he hasn't been to a meeting in two years, but he pays his dues!

<u>Changes To Last Month's Minutes</u>: There were a few changes to note. Lee Scales received a

membership award for 20 years of PCNC membership, not 25. Mary Ann Kono's name was misspelled Mary Anne.

Also, new member Matt Kelleher's information was reported slightly inaccurately. It was actually his uncle, Jack Flaherty, who was a principal at British Motor Cars, not his father. His other uncle, Forrest Faulknor, was the general sales manager of BMC. BMC was (and is) run by Kjell Qvale, and was deeply involved in the 'new' sport of sports car racing in the 1950s and 1960s.



PCNC Board Meeting Minutes 18 November, 2010

The board meet was called to order at 7:15 p.m., immediately before the monthly PCNC meeting. All board members were present except for Mike Drew, Steve Liebenow, and Trevor Fougere, with Tom Galli standing in for the missing Trevor.

Reno/Tahoe Fun Rally: It was formally announced that the next POCA Fun Rally will again be in Reno at the Circus Circus hotel, from 8-12 June.

PCNC Speed Trials: Larry Finch presented his plan for the track event to the rest of the board. The Reno-Fernley Raceway is again open for business, better than ever with fresh pavement, and construction plans for better amenities (including real restrooms).

Once again, the focus for the track event will be new drivers. Although Brand X cars are always welcome, the ambition will be to have new Pantera drivers on track, and to that end, special discounted pricing (the same as last year) will be offered to those drivers taking to the track for the first time in their Panteras. Regular participants will have the opportunity to save money with discounted entry fees for those whose payment is received by April 15th. All fees will remain unchanged from 2009.

Sponsorship remains an open question, as the economy has put the hurt on our traditional sponsors. We are anticipating a slight reduction in sponsorship, hopefully offset by a slight increase in driver participation. The ultimate financial forecast is for expenses and income to roughly mirror those of 2009, when we almost exactly broke even.

The board, upon hearing the plan, unanimously voted to approve the funding necessary to stage the event.

<u>Charity Donations</u>: PCNC historically has donated a percentage of our club's treasury to worthy charities at the end of the year. We are a bit behind schedule, but a listing of candidate charities will appear in the January newsletter, and a vote will be taken at the January meeting.

Awards: Gary Kono has compiled the listing of awards for those who hosted events, and Todd Glyer has printed the certificates. Brent Steward has calculated the most active member points, and Ron DeMaderios will decide who gets the President's Award.

<u>Christmas Party Raffle</u>: Trevor Fougere is 99% sure he will be well enough to attend the party, but as he is still recuperating from his recent surgery, Tom Galli will step in to organize the raffle, with assistance from Garth Rodericks. Mike Drew has solicited donations from almost 100 companies. The goal is for everybody to win something, and everyone to have fun!

<u>Club Records</u>: All old club records in private hands need to be forwarded to Forest Goodhart (club librarian) for record-keeping purposes. He will store both physical and electronic records.

The meeting adjourned at 7:45 p.m.

Timing Chain Tech Session

Lori Albino's Pantera has been improved greatly in the year and a half or so that she has been driving it, thanks to the efforts of numerous PCNC members who have kindly volunteered their time and labor to correct its many small deficiencies. The fact that Lori puts on one hell of a feed may have some additional motivational factor too!

During an oil pan change in the spring, it was noted that her original, stock timing chain was as flaccid and worn out as they come. Timing was probably advancing and retarding on its own, all over the place. When the original water pump started weeping, push finally met shove, and something had to be done.

The job would require perhaps two people to accomplish comfortably, but in traditional PCNC fashion, more than a dozen people showed up at her Benecia home on a sunny Halloween morning. Thankfully, as with virtually every Pantera, there was no shortage of small jobs that

needed attending to.

New club member Doug Johnson was the first to arrive, eager to both learn as much as he could and help out at the same time.

Lori's Pantera was curiously

equipped with 7/8-inch Sphereballs and bushings at the rear, but a 3/4-inch swaybar, meaning that it was rattling loose and of dubious effectiveness. A new one had been procured, so the evercheerful Rich Boschert set to work with

Unfortunately, the painted swaybar simply did not want to slide through the rather hard Sphereballs. Garry Choate to the rescue; with his 'use a bigger hammer' approach (literally), the bushings were pounded into position on the bar, and soon Rich had everything buttoned up again.

Meanwhile, Doug, Garry, Steve Dalcino, Bob Lucas and Randy Welch were all over, under and around the engine bay, draining the coolant, slightly lowering the oil pan, tearing the front of the motor apart and changing the timing chain.

Not all timing chains are created equal. Few manufacturers even make their own chain or sprockets; instead, most rely on outside suppliers and just piece the kits together. Some chain is of excellent quality, and some chain (Rolon, made in India) is just junk. Fortunately, 351C Guru Dan Jones was at the POCA Fun Rally; he went with Lori to the Summit Racing warehouse and eyeballed every single 351C timing chain set they had on offer. Half were condemned right away, leaving a bunch of more-or-less equal choices remaining. Prices varied a fair bit, and ultimately they chose the Ford Motorsport offering.

As the front of the engine came back together, Mike Haney installed a battery cutoff switch on a beautiful aluminum mount he fabricated. Once that was done, the two Mikes tore the windshield wiper mechanism out of the car.

Lori drives her Pantera in the rain, and on her last drive the wiper circuit blew the fuse. Bill Taylor had made a dedicated wiper circuit testing box, which proved invaluable in troubleshooting the problem.

Mike Drew has a fair bit of experience with the system, so he took it all apart, then the other Mike de-gunked it and greased it all up, and soon it was ready to go back into the car.

Meanwhile, throughout the day, monster chow was on offer inside the house, and everyone took a turn away from the action to load up on terrific Mexican food.

As the sun set, young trick-or-treat-

ers started to appear, and they were amply rewarded with lots of candy!

By 9:00 p.m., the car was all buttoned up again, right as rain. The next day, Lori took it for a spirited blast on a nearby abandoned twisty road, and the change in both engine and handling response was immediately discernible!

Thanks to everyone who came out to help. The list of tasks on Lori's Pantera is getting ever-smaller. A steering rack rebuild, A-arm bushing/ball joint/ tie rod end change, and heater and A/C installation are about all that are on the horizon for this car.

And then she's going to just drive the hell out of it!


