Minutes of Meeting 29 November, 2012

The meeting was called to order by the president at 8:01. All officers were present except for Mike Drew, Lori Albino and Larry Finch. There were 34 people in attendance, but zero De Tomaso automobiles due to the inclement weather.

<u>New Members/Guests</u>: The club welcomed **Greg Hiebert**, who is the proud new owner of a green '73 Pantera #5017, formerly owned by former PCNC member Mike Gianakis. Mike rarely drove the car so it needs some gentle TLC, but in general the mostly stock car is in terrific shape. Greg brought his friend **Mario Sousa** with him, who works at a performance car center.

John Colombero introduced his lovely guests, **Kim Colombero** (John's daughter-in-law), along with daughter **Genee** and his wife **Cheryl**. Kim has been working hard to help John out in the trying

weeks after his stroke, and Genee is an occupational therapist so she has been a tremendous help too. While introducing his family, John emotionally expressed his thanks for the support that has been shown to him by the members of the club, and he said he was working to 'not let the club down'. He said he misses working on and driving his Pantera, and that is the goal he is working towards!

<u>Changes To Last Month's Newsletter</u>: There were no changes noted. (However, the editor later noted that the date for the Super Bowl party was printed incorrectly on the back page, and although the minutes stated a flyer would be included, space limitations forced it to be held back until this month).

Club Treasury Report: Tom reported that we received our quarterly reimbursement from POCA, and Barry Hosier kindly donated \$20, the proceeds of the sale of a water tank to Ron DeMaderios at a previous meeting to the club's treasury. Expenses continue to outstrip income unfortunately, with the club's newsletter being the primary expense. We are looking at ways to raise additional funds in the new year.

<u>Club Store Report</u>: Along those lines, Bud had a nice rack displaying samples of new jackets, and had new design T-shirts laid out on the table. A zippered sweatshirt is now available, with new polo shirts in the works. He's still trying to decide if we want to have them embroidered or stenciled? He is also looking for feedback on a slightly new logo, a combination of the De Tomaso emblem and a running panther. He also wants to produce coffee mugs, but unfortunately he didn't have a sample available for viewing. The members in attendance showed a preference for the original PCNC logo versus the proposed new logo.

<u>Club Membership Report</u>: Greg had no new members to report. He said that five members were not receiving their period E-blasts, but he's working on it.

<u>Club Name Badge Report</u>: Lori wasn't present, but Forest brought up a proposal that had been discussed by the board, to consolidate some positions and functions. Returning the name badge duties to the Membership Coordinator is under consideration; Lori would then take over as Motorsports Coordinator, while Larry would continue to manage the Monterey Corral event.

This is still in the discussion phase, and no formal action has been taken yet. It will be up to the 2013 PCNC board to decide how to proceed.

It was decided to ask the membership at the general meeting to pass on their desires of what the site should be so that we will have a basis to start making any changes needed.

All-Italian Car and Motorcycle Show

I look forward to Columbus Day weekend each year because it signals the Alameda Special Olympics' "All Italian Car and Motorcycle Show," sponsored by the Alfa Romeo Association of California. This year the event was on Sunday, October 7, at Lincoln Middle School in Alameda.

The day began for Merry and me with a PCNC breakfast rendezvous at Elio's in San Leandro with Lori Albino, Mike Drew, Steve and Linda Liebenow, Kevin Abbey and his mom Angie. After a leisurely breakfast we took the scenic route to Alameda: down Doolittle Drive, past the old Oakland Airport (of Amelia Earhart fame) along San Leandro Bay past Otis Spunkmeyer Field, Bay Farm Island, and the Aeolian Yacht Club to Lincoln Middle School, which is on the southern tip of Alameda Island. A fence separates the cars from San Leandro Bay.

The Alfa Club arranges the cars in concentric circles in the order they arrive, so the cars of any specific marque may be scattered over an area of several acres. You park next to who knows what. The homogeneous atmosphere

relaxes the "marque specific" intensity that you sometimes see at other shows. You get to know other marques and the people who own them. For some reason, this show draws more gear-heads like us rather than investors who hire their work done (I really like these people). I learned that those "cheap, poor quality, outsourced parts" that De Tomaso used to "nickel and dime" our

cars are the very same, very expensive, very high quality, outsourced parts (right down to the part numbers) that Ferrari and Maserati used on their cars. In some cases, De Tomaso engineering makes Ferrari engineering look rather shabby (308 fans and radiators or 365 GTB/4 headlight mechanisms, for example).

As you might expect (since the




