Minutes of Meeting 27 May, 1999

<u>New Members/Guests</u>: There were a few fresh faces in the crowd. Michael Kliment recently heard about us and is looking for a Pantera, and came to the meeting to see what he could learn. **Bob Keels,** Shari Stock's brother was also in the room, a guest of Larry and Shari.

<u>Corrections to Las Month's Minutes</u>: The minutes of the previous meeting were forgotten, and thus approved!

<u>Club Library Report</u>: As the librarian was AWOL, there was no report.

<u>Club Treasury Report</u>: Anita was busy with lots of financial transactions since the last meeting. We will be making our final payment to Los Laurales Lodge in the next few weeks, but are still in the black.

<u>Club Store Report</u>: Bill handed out financial reports summarizing the club store's sales in Las Vegas. Some items (particularly the custom jackets) sold much better than anticipated, while other items fell short of expectations. We actually had numerous orders for jackets, above and beyond those that we brought to sell in Las Vegas. Overall, the club did at least at well as in previous years.

Past Events:

Las Vegas Fun Rally: Michael Fertitta had a display of photographs from the Fun Rally. He described the alternate route that the Fertittas, Mike Drew and George Gordon-Smith drove. Their route took them along scenic twisty roads and the travel time was actually a bit less than the traditional freeway route.

Chuck Melton reported that the track event was an outstanding success, both for the club and for the participants. Larry Stock had a tough day however, as one of his two cars couldn't make it onto the track and the other one blew up in spectacular fashion with Shelly Monfort at the helm! Chuck thanked Ed Kornegay and the members of Checkered Flag Racing who came forward to help make the day such a success. He reminded PCNC members that they're welcome at any and all Checkered Flag track events.







Planes, Trains and Automobiles Part III

The third and final segment of The PCNC Trilogy Tour was run on May 8th. It had been rescheduled from November of last year, after rain had forced a cancellation. Fifteen PCNC members and four Lockheed Sports Car Club members arrived for breakfast at the Alum Rock Garden Restaurant, along with a very eclectic mix of sports cars. This collection included four Panteras, a Cobra, a Dinan BMW M3, a 300ZX Twin Turbo, a Toyota MR2 Turbo, a Mini Cooper on steroids, a Ford Probe, and a diesel pickup truck.

We shared the restaurant with what looked like the entire San Jose Police Department. We knew that we had picked a good breakfast place, since those tough food critics were in attendance!

After breakfast, we had the requisite parking lot car check-out session, and then we were on our way for the short drive to the Antique Airplane Museum at the San Martin (South County) airport. We were greeted by PCNC club member Byron Hight, who proceeded to take us on a tour of the museum. They have a small but excellent collection of aviation memorabilia, and Byron provided interesting anecdotes about the displays.

Afterwards, we helped roll out the GeeBee replica race plane which the museum is sheltering for the pilot/owner between airshows. We took the opportunity to take photos with the cars arranged next to the GeeBee. For those that are unfamiliar with the plane, the GeeBee was a 1930's-era race plane design which is all engine (radial-style), with a short, stubby fuselage and wings. The original versions had a design flaw and ended up killing most of the pilots that flew them. This replica has corrected that flaw, and it is an amazing plane to see in the aerobatic routine that the pilot performs.

The next part of the tour took us south through Hollister, and onto the J-1 highway for a great 50-mile run of winding, climbing, descending, and sometimes narrow roads. This road has an amazing variety of surfaces, elevation changes and turns, all of which keep the driver in a constant state of anticipation! This is not a road for the faint of heart!

We tried to maintain a respectable pace, and we were satisfied when we pulled over at the end of the road to wait for Dave and Dianna Crego to catch up in their pickup truck. I walked back to Lee Scales' car (who had been right behind me the whole way), to ask him what he thought of the drive, and he was beaming! With schoolboy enthusiasm, he said "That was great...I felt like Michael Schumacher and you were Mika Hakkinen and we were dicing it up in a Formula 1 race!"


The highway connects with Interstate 5, which we then took north to connect with Highway 152 east, and on up to the town of Atwater, which is home to the former Castle Air Force Base and the Castle Air Museum. We posed the Panteras in front of the SR-71 spy plane which is on display at the entrance gate. We also met up with Jack Bartole and Jane Gehrig who had driven down to meet us. The museum is an outdoor display of over 40 Air Force airplanes spanning a 50-year history of military aircraft. Lee Scales provided many fascinating facts and stories of each airplane.

After our walking tour, we headed up Highway 99 to Modesto, and ended our tour at St. Stan's Brewpub. We received a short tour of the brewery from the owner, who told us they started brewing beer for themselves and their neighbors in a barn! Their beer became so popular, that they decided that they should start selling it so they could recoup some of their expenses. Their current location has been open about 12 years, and has great food, and, of course, excellent beer! There is nothing like a really good beer after you've been out in the valley in 90 degree heat all day! We all had an excellent meal, and when we finished, headed home well satisfied with ourselves and our vehicles!




