Minutes of Meeting July 29, 1999



For all of you who were at the last "Fix Whatever Ails Ya" Tech session, and got a bite of Judy DeRyke's "Green-Chili Bake" casserole, and requested the recipe, here it is!



Green-Chili Bake

2 tablespoons butter or margarine

1 1/2 cups chopped onion

2 garlic cloves, minced

1/4 teaspoon ground Cumin

3 cups cooked rice

5 eggs (or 1 1/4 cups egg substitute)

Preheat oven to 375 degrees.

Melt butter in a skillet over medium-high heat. Add onion and garlic; sauté 5 minutes. Remove from heat, stir in cumin. Combine the onion mixture, rice and eggs in a bowl. Combine tomatoes and tomato sauce in another bowl. Combine cheeses in a third bowl.

Spread 1 1/4 cups of the tomato mixture in the bottom of a 13" X 9" baking dish; top with 1 1/2 cups of the rice mixture. Arrange half of the green chiles on top of the rice mixture and sprinkle with half of the cheese mixture. Repeat the procedure with the remaining tomato, rice and chiles.

Bake, uncovered, at 375 degrees for 30 minutes. Sprinkle with the remaining cheese mixture and bake an additional 5 minutes, or until cheese is melted. (Judy put the cheese mixture on before baking, since she made the dish ahead of time, and it seemed okay that way too.)

Yield: 6 servings (as a main dish).

<u>Optional:</u> You could probably add a cup of shredded cooked chicken, or browned ground beef to the rice mixture, for a more substantial dish.

1 (14.5 oz.) can Mexican-style tomatoes

1 (8 oz.) can tomato sauce

1 cup (4 oz.) shredded Monterey Jack cheese (reduced-fat, if desired)

1/2 cup (2 oz.) shredded Manchego cheese (or more Monterey Jack)

3 (4 oz.) cans whole green chiles, drained and cut into strips
