#### **Upcoming Events:**

<u>Mission City Classique Car Show — 2 October</u>: This car show benefiting the Santa Clara Unified School District will be held at Central Park in Santa Clara. 
#### Club Business:





# Pantera Club of Northern California Chassis Setup Clinic Saturday, 23 October

Panteras are capable of exceptional handling when equipped with the stock suspension, and this can be improved by the fitment of aftermarket shocks, springs and swaybars. But with the ability to adjust comes the ability to screw things up!

If you have installed aftermarket springs or adjustable shocks, it's virtually certain that they are out of adjustment. You can't just set them evenly, slap them on and believe that your car will weight the same side-to-side. In order for your Pantera to handle correctly in both right and left turns, ride heights and corner weights (wedge) *must* be adjusted correctly.

Professional race chassis engineer Gary Roys will be flying in from Detroit armed with a comprehensive battery of chassis measurement and adjustment tools. We will have four individual scales, linked by a common computer processor that will enable us to determine individual corner weights, rear/front weights, left-right weights and cross weights with all associated percentages. He will then adjust the ride height and corner weights accordingly to give you the optimum percentages to achieve the best handling for your Pantera.

At the same time, we will have laser alignment measurement tools which will enable you to check your toe, caster and camber. The first ten people will even get free t-shirts!

Even if your Pantera is bone-stock, you can still use the scales to evaluate the setup of your car and see how much it weighs. The stock suspension doesn't allow any adjustments however.

Cost for a full suspension analysis and adjustment is a mere **\$50**. This service would cost hundreds and hundreds of dollars at a race shop! For those with stock suspensions, you can get your car weighed at all four corners for only **\$10**, such a bargain! Best of all, the proceeds all go to PCNC!

To make your reservation, contact **Mike Drew at (707) 452-9284 or MikeLDrew@aol.com** and state your preference for a morning or afternoon evaluation. All marques are welcome although DeTomaso cars will of course receive priority.

And of course, the world-famous PCNC tech crew will be in place to help perform any number of mechanical chores, from electrical to tuning to major operations such as clutch replacements, steering rack rebuilds, etc. If you've got an overdue maintenance problem why not bring your Pantera down and get it sorted by the pros?


